Parkinson's Touches us All

1.6% of people over the age of 65 will be diagnosed with Parkinson's disease.

Estimate of people under 50 who are diagnosed with young onset Parkinson's disease. This figure continues to rise each year.^{4,6}

Men are 1.5x as likely to get Parkinson's as women.5
