

Do you have Parkinson's Disease and have difficulty walking?

You could help us develop an assistive robotic device to improve walking in people with Parkinson's Disease



The Wyss Institute and the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences at Harvard University is developing a soft, wearable, assistive suit to improve walking and independence in persons who have walking impairments, such as in Parkinson's Disease.

This research study will involve one or more visits that will examine how you walk with or without the assistive suit. Photos and videos may be taken.

Joining our study will give you a chance to try and wear next-generation exosuits that are designed to improve walking through bigger steps, faster speeds, and more regular walking rhythm. Testing sessions will be administered by a Physical Therapist. Your insurance will not be billed.

Eligibility:

1. 18-75 years old
2. Have trouble walking
3. Be able to walk at least 20 meters independently (with device OK, but no assistance from another person)
4. Be able to understand, and communicate with study staff

Benefit:

You could receive up to \$550 in gift cards over the course of the study. Compensation for travel and parking is also available.
