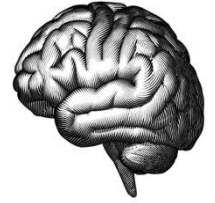




PERCEPTION IN PARKINSON'S DISEASE

A Boston University Research Study



- ⇒ We are examining how perception (basic vision, unusual perceptual experiences, including but not limited to visual hallucinations) in Parkinson's disease relates to other parts of everyday life, such as thinking, mood, and alertness/sleepiness.
- ⇒ If eligible, you will receive an online questionnaire by email. This will take 45 minutes to 1 hour to complete.

We are looking for volunteers who:

- **Have a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease without dementia, are age 40 or older, and are proficient English speakers**
- **Have functional vision**
- **Have internet access, and access to a desktop computer or laptop**

- ⇒ There is no monetary or other compensation for this study
- ⇒ **Why should you participate?** We are developing new treatments to help individuals with PD who have unusual perceptual experiences. The survey information from you will help us target the problems that people with PD are most concerned about.
